During the course of meetings with the market vendors, we found a way to ensure the farmers market success by finding alternative sources of revenue or support. It wasn't all born upon the vendors. Because, without the vendors, we have nothing. All along, we were discussing the necessity of a new manager.

Luckily, we uncovered the Farmers Market manager candidate that lives in the apartment at the Kent Land Trust office. We proposed the compensation plan for the farmers market manager and presented it to her, and she happily accepted. That was it! Nancy Rohr was our new manager. Nancy then jumped in early on to help corral some new vendors and make sure we retain the past vendors. Working together with the rest of the Chamber, we discussed having sponsors to support the Market. We then reached out to several key businesses in the area and pitched the benefits and exposure they would get being a sponsor of the farmers market. Many of them were excited and quickly agreed to sponsor the events for this year. We raised a lot of money and had their signs made that are prominently displayed in the center of the farmers market weekly. In addition, we are promoting them on social media, so everyone knows these sponsors made the farmers market possible."
